

Crochet Pot Scrubbers

Supplies:

Nylon Netting - or - Scrubby Yarn
N Hook (I Hook for Scrubby Yarn)

Directions:

KEY:

beg - beginning

hdc - half double crochet

ch - chain

sl st - slip stitch

dc - double crochet

sp(s) - space(s)



Cut Nylon Netting into 2" wide strips. When you have about 10" remaining in the strip, tie another strip to the end and trim. This way, you don't use up your netting by tying all the strips together and having short pieces to work before you come to a knot.

1. Ch 4, sl st in first ch to form ring, ch 3(counts as dc), 11 dc in ring; join with sl st in 3rd ch of beg ch-3. (12 dc)

2. Ch 2 (counts as hdc), hdc in same st as joining, 2 hdc in each st around; join with sl st in 2nd ch of beg ch-2. Fasten off.

Other Side: Repeat 1 & 2, using an extra length of netting. Do not fasten off or cut the excess netting. You will use this left over length to join the circles.

Joining Circles: With wrong sides of each circle facing each other, tuck any loose tails between the two circles. Working through both sides at the same time, sl st in each st around with the remaining length from the 2nd circle. Fasten off.

I tie the last knot a little loosely and cut the net off leaving about four inches. I gently slip my hook into one circle and out the top, then grab the tail and pull it in, pulling the knot inside, or as closely as possible.

*If you are working with the new Scrubby yarn, you will need to repeat #2 for an extra row. Otherwise, the pot scrubber will be small.
